England's Glory

It is over fifty years since the England football team won the World Cup. In 1966 the finals were held in England and the final took place at the old Wembley Stadium in London on Saturday July 30th. England had reached the final where they were to play West Germany. After 90 minutes the score was two all so thirty minutes of extra time had to be played to decide who would win the World Cup. Eventually England won 4—2 with Geoff Hurst scoring three goals (a hat-trick). It was a fantastic achievement and many people in the country were exceptionally happy. The manager of the team was called Alf Ramsey and as a way to say thank you he was knighted - he became Sir Alf Ramsey. Geoff Hurst was also knighted but not until 1998.

Since then England have tried to repeat this achievement but have never done so. 1966 remains a highlight of England's football achievement. Who knows when it will be repeated?
